Treasurer's Report for 2015

Income

Our subscriptions numbers are once again down, however the increased fee for the Physics day non members cost does give us more income. In 2015 we had 14 secondary school, 2 primary school and 1 individual as part of our member ship, this is down on numbers in 2014. The issue of distinguishing between NZASE and ASTA subscriptions still exists.

The Physics Day was very successful in all ways, in numbers attending and PD. My thanks to the efforts of Kate McKinney who single handedly looked after collecting the money, sending invoices till after the event. It was successful also in making a profit of over \$2000. The income for the Physics Day is lower as registration costs were lowerered compared to 2014 when extra was charged as an overseas speaker was involved and there were additional costs associated with this.

Expenditure

AGM - Cost is up as we had a lot more people in attendance.

Meetings - includes e-learning event, ASTA Committee Meetings and the Exam Discussion evening.

Science Fairs - NIWA Central \$250, North Harbour \$750, Manukau \$500, we have not supported the North Harbour Fair for a few years and the Manukau Fair was new for ASTA in 2015.

Sponsorship - 5 people attained grants for attending Conferences - Sena Choi and Ian Torrie (St Cuthberts College) and Carolyn Haslam. 2 people awarded grants were not able to go to a conference.

Support Groups -Chemistry. A reminder that there is a sum of \$100 available to support groups for tea, coffee and incidentals for their meetings. Please make a request to me to receive this, via email is fine.

Other - Gifts, Petrol vouchers (reimburse committee members and speakers for their travel)

Dinner - Cost was down even on last years figure. The raffle was very successful. Overall cost was \$518.00 which included supplying the wine, gifts for Life members and spot prizes.

Physics day - Overall cost was 2632.73 this included flights and transport for David Housden from NZIP, leaving a profit of \$2342.27,

The money from NZASE (\$18,000) has been put into a high interest savings account which means it is on call but earning a higher interest rate than a short term deposit, the Term Deposit #73 expires on 10th May and will automatically be added to this Savings account also, so the ASTA funds are looking quite healthy.
